President's Report for Year Ending June 30, 1974

Since last year at this time we have held 14 board meetings, the usual four Sectional Tournaments and a highly successful Spring Nations with an attendance of 8329 tables.

Several new clubs have opened, six members have taken their directors' test, a new Ethics Committee has been appointed, we have a net gain of at least 100 members, and 20 more players for a total of 122 have achieved the status of LM.

Allan Graves and Mike Strebinger won the right to represent B.C. on the Canadian Contingent for the World Pairs olympiad in the Canary Islands. The Vancouver team of Ron Borg, Buddy Crapko, Jim Donaldson, Paul Hagen, Bob Connop and Phyllis Novak won the right to represent District 19 and then finished second in Zone VII defeating District 18 who were represented by a tough Edmonton team but losing to Portland.

Chuck Campbell, our treasurer, was elected President of the UBC Alumni Association.

I wish to express my appreciation to my fellow board members, all committee members, those who have helped behind the scenes, and all that have offered constructive criticism. Finally, I wish to thank spouses of these people without whose support nothing could be accomplished.

CONDUCT AT ACBL SANCTIONED EVENTS

Any conduct which is detrimental to the best interests of patrons at any unit sponsored event will be dealt with if the Unit Conduct and Ethics Committee or the Unit Board receive a written and signed complaint or charge following an approach to the Director in charge.

We had the misfortune to witness unacceptable conduct at the July unit game following the annual meeting. Three letters of complaint were forwarded to the Unit Conduct and Ethics Committee who quickly met and made recommendations to the Board.

A specially convened meeting, comprising eight members of the Board barred the guilty party from the August unit game and passed further sactions by a simple majority. These other sanctions were not imposed, but instead referred to the next regular meeting of the Board.

Nature of the Competition:

The qualifying round has two sessions.
The event will be scored with IMP pairs

scoring, with as large a number of boards as time and the size of the field permits. The top TEN pairs in order of finishing in each of the two categories will qualify for the finals.

The final round will also have IMP pairs scoring, converted to victory points and will consist of nine nine-board matches.

ENTRY FEE: Qualifying Round: \$4.50 per player for the whole day

Final Round: \$2.00 per player for the whole day

The team to play against Seattle, in Seattle this year, are determined as follows: in each division the top FOUR finishing pairs in the finals are automatically qualified for the team. These four pairs shall meet and choose a fifth pair to complete the team.

Registration:

PRE-REGISTRATION IS MANDATORY FOR THIS EVENT to insure a proper movement of people and boards at game time. There will be a cutoff date after which no new entries will be accepted. It is up to you to see that you are registered before the cutoff date arrives. 
